FAQs:

Q. What are studio spaces like at Caumsett?

A. Caumsett's workspace is a one-hundred-year-old barn. The space is 720 square feet and has eight-foot-high walls, three small windows and a vaulted ceiling. Caumsett is providing two eight-foot long-work tables, a professional hanging system, studio chairs, an easel, and lighting.

Q. Can a guest, friend, spouse, partners, significant other, gallerist, mentor, artist, etc. visit residents inside the residency houses?

A. Yes, the park is open to the public. For those who do not have an Empire Pass, the park charges an \$8 entry fee. Fees are collected on the following:
4/6 - 5/27/24, 8:00 am - 4:00 pm Weekends Only
5/28 - 9/2/24, 8:00 am - 4:00 pm Daily
9/7 - 10/14/24, 8:00 am - 4:00 pm Weekends & Holidays

Q. Can residents bring a pet and or can pets visit?

A. No, Caumsett is a State Park and no animals are allowed.

Q. Are meals/food provided for residents?

A. Caumsett provides a \$500-1,000 stipend which may be spent however the artist decides. The stipend amount is determined by the artist's length of residency. There is a cafe which will be open Thursday-Sunday across from the resident's work space and the Foundation will be happy to provide a detailed list of groceries and local restaurants. Delivery services such as seamless, ubereats and doordash deliver to the park.

Q. Is there Wi-fi at Caumsett?

A. Yes.

Q. Does Caumsett have insurance to protect my work?

A. Not at this time. Artists are responsible for all of their works and personal items.
